The recipients of the "GEI AWARDS 2015" include: Claudio Del Vecchio, for his accomplishments in Italy and abroad in the field of entrepreneurship; Amalia Ercoli Finzi, a top international expert in aerospace engineering who has made valuable contributions to the success of the Rosetta project; Maestro Gualtiero Marchesi for his contributions to the prosperity of Italian gastronomy across the globe; Bruno Vespa for elevating Italian journalism to levels of international importance throughout his career, which, indeed, has been marked by many outstanding accomplishments; and Roberto Vittori, the Italian astronaut who furthered Italian excellence in advanced technology in space (where an Italian astronaut is currently in orbit).
